Appendix 1 – Behaviour Policy Rewards

1 Housepoints

Every child in the School is a member of one of the four houses, named:

- Sandringham
- Buckingham
- Windsor
- Balmoral

Housepoints may be given to children by any of the staff of the school. Housepoints can be given for a number of reasons including:

- Good work
- Effort
- Being polite or helpful – e.g. holding a door open
- Being ready at the start of a lesson
- Following instructions

The school has four house captains, elected every September by the children of their house. The prospective candidates will give a speech and be elected by secret ballot. The Captains will support their house, as necessary. The house captains will show visitors around the School and undertake duties for the benefit of the School.

House points are recorded on a house point chart, found in each classroom. Each child records their house points on the chart and weekly these points are collected by Year 6 and totalled. Each week the winning house is read out to the rest of the school in Assembly. The winning house is displayed on the Assembly board and the ribbon colours displayed on the house point cup and reported in the newsletter.

At the end of each term, the house with the most points will be rewarded with a treat. They will be able to choose from a variety of options eg. cooking, sports etc. The reward will occur in school for half a day.

2. Class special target chart

Each class has a class special target chart. The class teacher, in consultation with the class, sets two or three targets. The children choose the reward they want – e.g. extra playtime. The teacher gives a sticker every time the class achieve one of the targets as a whole.

3. **Star of the day**

Every day, one child will receive a wristband for being a star that day. This award can be given for anything that the teacher feels needs praise.

- 4. **Star of the Week**

Each week, two children in each class will be chosen as stars of the week. There will be a focus each week on different aspects of the multiple intelligence ideas put forward by Howard Gardner.

Kinaesthetic - Body Smart

Linguistic - Word Smart

Logical - Number Smart

Interpersonal - People Smart

Intrapersonal - Self Smart

Musical - Music Smart

Visual/Spatial - Picture Smart

Naturalistic - Nature Smart

We will put posters up around the School to develop whole school understanding towards multiple intelligence. The children who are chosen each week will have their names in the weekly newsletter.

5. **Raffle Tickets**

Both in class and on the playground the children can earn stickers for good behaviour. The stickers can be swapped for a raffle ticket. The raffle tickets are drawn out each week with 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes. The School Council choose the prizes.
