

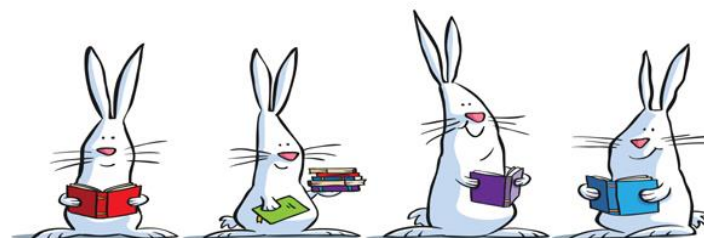
If you like, why not draw of a picture from one of the books you read here – it can be an illustration from the book or the cover or from your own imagination.

Your challenge is to read over the Easter holidays. Choose 3 from the different genres.

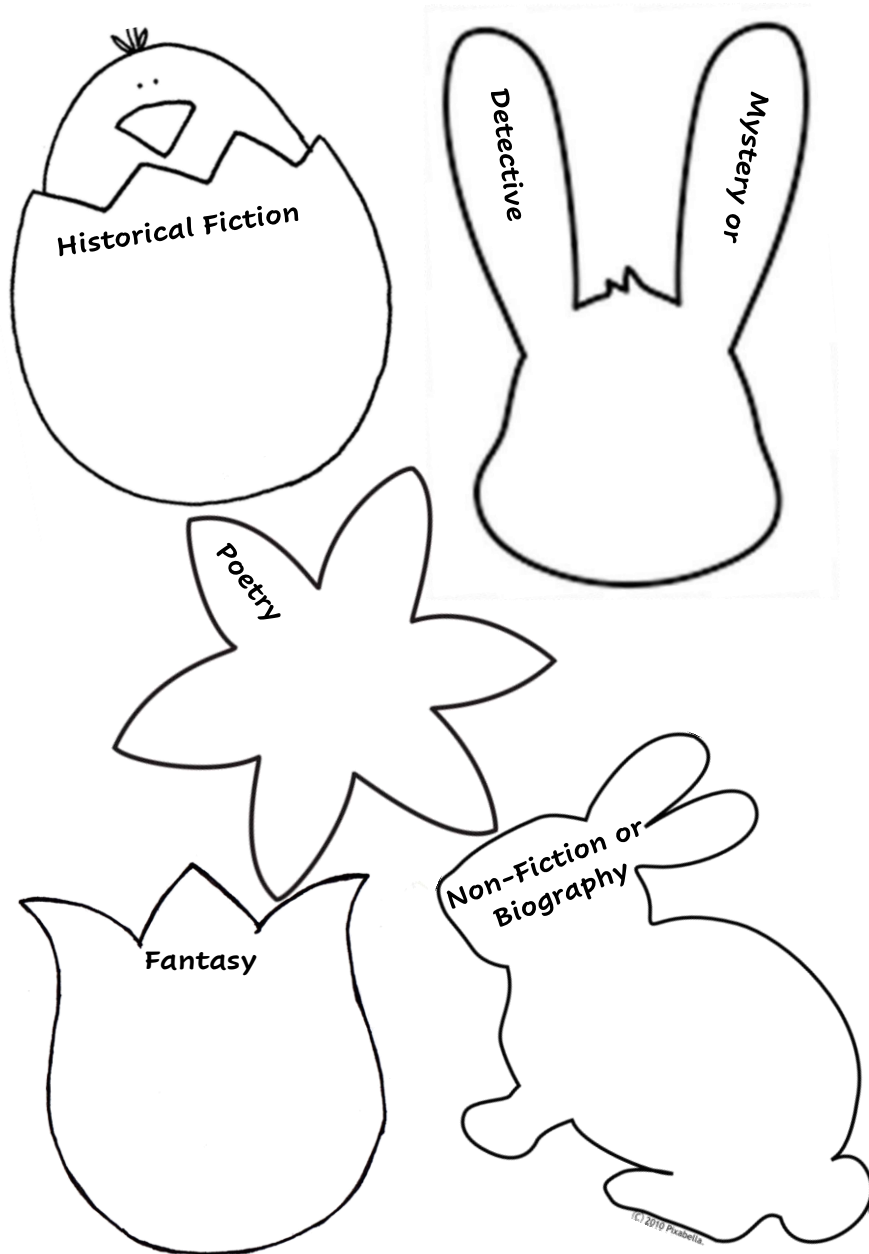
For older children reading chapter books (we know these are longer!), you can read a mixture of chapter books, picture books and information books if you like.
