This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Music is valued at Parkgate Junior School and we have beautiful whole school singing. Children are taught music each week for at least 45 minutes by class teachers, many of whom have a musical background. In addition, pupils sing daily and have a Friday singing assembly, where new songs are taught for different times of the year.

Singing ties in with our wider curriculum including PSHE and important British events.

We apply for wider opportunities funding for whole class musical instrument teaching and in the past we have had singing and violin lessons, culminating in singing at St Albans Abbey and performing at school.

During lessons pupils learn about different instruments, different styles and genres of music as well as singing, improvising, composing and performing on tuned and untuned percussion.

We regularly sing with the Infant School, enjoying singing together and participating in part and round songs during our Parkgate days.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

At Parkgate Junior School we offer music tuition for a wide range of instruments, but at present focus on wind, violin, piano and guitar. In addition, we can offer drums with an external provider.

We have a very active Choir who perform a wide repertoire for various events throughout the year and with different audiences. This is a free club to enable all to participate.

We work with the local Music Hub and have had wider opportunities with singing and violin in recent years.

We have had visitors from the local Watford Brass Band, drumming workshops and during Cross Curricular week, local visitors add their musical expertise to the lessons.

Many of our musical children attend Music Days for their instruments through the Music Hub where they go and play with lots of other children and greatly enjoy it.

Disadvantaged children can apply for free instrument lessons and the loan of instruments. The school has a number of instruments available for loan. Parents and carers pay for their children's lessons and can choose to have individual or group sessions.

We have a dedicated space for children to have lessons and practise their insturments.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.
